







We have requested the assistance of the National Park Service at Little Bighorn Battlefield, an agency of the Department of Interior, to help us in this important family endeavor. We do this because North Dakota, South Dakota, and the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe have not honored their promise for proper care and maintenance of our Grandfather's burial sites.


